Village Board News

Roadwork Update

It's a sure sign of spring – roadwork! The Village Board recently approved a number of resolutions to get our 2018 road program started. The Board approved asphalt and concrete material purchases, water and sewer upgrades, and approved professional services for the installation of right turn lanes at North Avenue and Lake Street and Irving Park Road and East Avenue.



Comprehensive Plan Forum



A public forum on the final draft of the Village Comprehensive Plan was held on April 17. Residents and businesses came out to see the final recommended plans. The key findings focused on making connections throughout the community. Plan elements include enhancing and improving our bicycle and pedestrian system, considering more walkable developments, and bringing neighborhoods together through bridges across Sutton and Bartlett

Roads. The final plan will be up for consideration by the Village Board in May.

Village Hall Renovation

The Village Board approved a contract for professional services to develop drawings for renovations to Village Hall and Public Works' front office. Significant changes to the buildings focus on making more efficient use of space and improving access to services for people with disabilities. The costs for these renovations were included in the 2018 Budget.

KITTIE'S KORNER

PARKING is prohibited on Village streets between the hours of 1:00-5:00 am except where noted in specific subdivisions. **Blocking the sidewalk** is prohibited from March 1 through November 30. Vehicles parked in residential driveways CANNOT block the sidewalk or parkway between the hours of 7:00 am and 9 pm, Monday through Friday; and from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday. 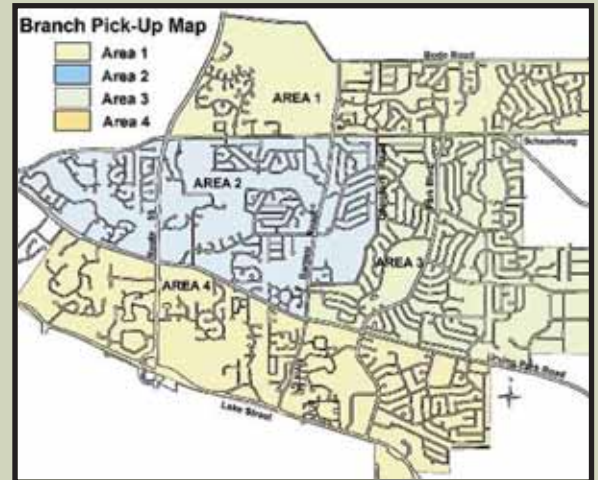
Branch Pickup

Public Works collects branches, free of charge, from your curbside during designated collection weeks. Place branches at the curb by 6:00 am on the Monday your area is scheduled for pickup. It is important to have your branches out by Monday morning in order to avoid being missed by the branch pickup crews.

Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. **Branches cannot be longer than ten feet (10') in length, and have a diameter of no larger than six (6) inches.**

The Village is divided into four areas for pickup service (see map). Each area receives branch pickup service one week of the month.

Sign Up for Email Billing Today!



Go paperless! Follow the instructions on our website to setup your account on Streamwood Self Service. Log into your Streamwood Self Service account and under **Account Summary** click on **Bill Delivery Preferences**. Select **Email**, enter your email address, click **Update**, and you're done! You will be sent an email every month as soon as your bill is ready to view – up to 5 days faster than regular mail! It's SAFE, SECURE and CONVENIENT.

While you're online, you can also make easy, safe, secure, and fast payment using Streamwood Self Service. Simply select your **Account** then select **Manage Bills**. View your bill and add it to your cart! Bills are generally processed within 24 hours.

Noise Control Regulations

The Village has noise control regulations setting specific hours to avoid neighborhood concerns. Noise complaints in residential areas include loud music, late night parties, yelling, and shouting. Concerns in business areas focus around amplified sounds, garbage collection, and loading and unloading. No construction, loud music, garbage collection, loading and unloading will be permitted between the hours of 10:00 pm and 7:00 am on weekdays, and 10:00 pm and 10:00 am on the weekends. Exceptions are permitted for emergencies and permitted events. If you are concerned about loud noises in your area, please contact the Police Department by calling 9-1-1.

Garbage Can Placement

Just a reminder that garbage and recycling totes and other cans or receptacles cannot be stored in the front yard. Totes, cans and bins must be stored behind the front of the building, in a side or rear yard, or within your garage.

Summer Lunch Program

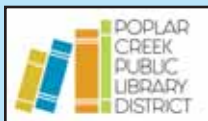

School District U-46

Streamwood Career Exploration Highlights



The Manufacturing Team

School District U-46 students participated for the fourth year in the Streamwood Career Exploration Program (SCEP). The program, which ran during March 2018 spring break, allowed high school students to get involved with the businesses in our community. Students learned about career options and blended what they've learned in the classroom to real-world scenarios in business.

The first year focused on manufacturing businesses, and promoted the concept of 'white collar manufacturing.' The second year expanded to include education options, programming, and certifications at Elgin Community College. Last year, the program shifted focus with 15 students working with local retail businesses. Students were presented with real life business concerns, and had to work with area businesses to craft workable solutions.

This year's program offered career exploration in three fields: manufacturing, business, and early childhood education. The program served 30 students; 10 in each field. The manufacturing group toured area manufacturers, and learned production line runs by creating two products. The business group was divided into two teams. The first worked with Heidner Properties to devise a marketing plan for Gigi's Café; the second worked with Fiesta Market to develop a solution to parking and circulation at the store. The early childhood group was also divided into two teams, both working with Streamwood Park District on the development of summer programs and lesson plans.
